

#### PFL Report – Marrina

In addition, the Friends were asked to put a PFL on to their own library web site. There was some interest in a PayPal donation system but it's complicated and there are many requirements that are making it difficult to implement. Levy action teams brought back lists of recommendations one of them being an increase in funding, how much being the question. Eva Calcagno shared regarding the 2015 levy update and the different ways to increase funding by creatively refining the wording to promote the passage of the levy. Each library is asked to poll and see where the interest lies with library support and times were discussed as to when to do the neighborhood canvasing. The next meeting will be held in January of 2015.

# Park Board Meeting – Carolyn, Marrina

Our group was the first to give input on the needs of the library and the online book sales. The meeting was a question and answer session and gave different layouts of the possible expansions. The builders were most interested in how Jessie Mays was used, and what the needs are from the different organizations. There was also discussion regarding our movie night and how we could make better use of the space to make it cozier for this event as well as other events such as the book club which is currently held at the Library. There will be another meeting October 22 and Carolyn asked if there would be any able to attend to be a listening ear to hear how the meeting is progressing and to hear from other groups that utilize Jessie Mays for their events.

#### **Engraving of the Tile – Chris Lantz (report given by Carolyn)**

Chris Lantz was not able to get the final proof back from the engraver. The donation from Pat Web's family will go toward the engraving cost and the rest of the donated funds will go to buy books that can having name placards with her name inside. Debra also mentioned that the lighting outside could be upgraded with photocell lights to allow the lights to turn on automatically at night instead of the current system that is in place.

#### Popcorn Report - Marrina & Carolyn
