Friends Meeting called to order by Debbie Olson, at 7:10 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

David Hatcher made a motion; Norma Tucker seconded the motion to approve the January 10, 2022 minutes. Approval was unanimous by all members.

LIBRARY DIRECTOR REPORT: Robin Doughty

March 2022 Circulation statistics reflect a 22% increase in checkouts over March 2021. Monthly circulation is returning to pre-pandemic levels and the number of library visitors is increasing. April is Volunteer Appreciation month. Robin's report highlighted the outreach accomplishments by Carol Aldrich and acknowledged several new library volunteers. Both Youth and Adult Services have expanded and been well attended. A Strategic Plan Stakeholders Meeting is scheduled April 25th at Jessie Mays Community Center; Debbie Olson will represent the FNPPL. See the Full Report

FINANCIAL REPORT: Treasurer - Norma Tucker

From January to March 2022, FNPPL Total Income was \$2456.81; Total Expenses was \$4234.41. The largest expenditure was \$4000 for library collection. See the Full Report

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Friends Online Book Sales (FOBS) – Debbie Olson

Sales have dropped after the end-of-year holidays. Debbie reported that the water main at the FOBS house broke and there are no plans to restore water to that location. City leaders and Friends have not identified a new location for FOBS to operate. Friends will continue to house

the online inventory and operations in the current location and use library facilities as needed. David will look further into the circumstances and planning schedule.

Carol Aldrich offered to help schedule volunteers to move more books to the storage unit. [UPDATED INFO 4-20-22: David asked how online sales compared with last year. Compared to January through March 2021, FOBS through March 2022 sold 16 fewer items, but raised \$271 more.] See the Full Sales Report






